You no longer need to contact the DOT department to check your or your drivers status. You can now obtain this information DIRECTLY from the new DOT DRIVER STATUS CHECK page!

Supervisors, drivers, anyone who has access to the UPRR webpage can access and utilize this webpage by following these instructions:

- 1- Go to the UPRR EMPLOYEE Webpage at <http://www.uprr.com/suppliers/index.shtml>
- 2 - Click on DRIVER STATUS under the DOT section
- 3 - Type in the appropriate employee id
- 4 - Hit SUMMIT

You will be able to determine the following information:

- A - Certification Status
- B - What documents or forms that are missing, expired or both
- C - Move cursor over missing or expired field for a copy of the form
- D - The capability of printing the form right from the webpage
- E - DOT fax number provided.

A person can check the site periodically to ensure forms are received and processed.
